The CBSP, which was developed through months of consultation with the community, a Citizens Advisory Committee, staff and Council, was approved by Council on September 21. The next step is for staff to ncorporate the five goals, as well as the objectives and action items, into their departmental work plans and oudgets for 2016 and beyond.

The five goals address the overarching vision of how the community wants to see Collingwood over the next ten to 15 years.

The public will be updated as progress is made on the CBSP goals and objectives. Every edition of this newsletter will contain an update, as will the monthly e-newsletter. (www.collingwood.ca/newsletter)

Accountable Ш **Local Government**

This goal incorporates fiscal restraint and responsibility, such as asset management and debt management. lt also covers communications and a commitment to implementing the CBSP over the long term.

Public Access to a **Revitalized Waterfront**

The waterfront came up as a key area of importance in all the public sessions. The main objective for this goal is to develop a waterfront master plan and a request for interest in bidding on a consulting contract for the Waterfront Master Plan was issued in early October.

Support for **Economic Growth**

On the heels of the Economic Development Strategy, this goal will facilitate the growth of the local economy to attract a diverse labour force and maintain a strong and sustained local economy. It includes action items related to affordable housing and local transit.

Healthy Lifestyle

The pursuit of a healthy lifestyle plays a large part in the activities that Collingwood offers and is known for in all four seasons. This goal will work towards contributing to sustained healthy, active living for all residents.

Culture and the Arts

This goal will cultivate educational opportunities and events that encourage the development of culture and the arts within Collingwood.

RECONSTRUCTION UPDATE - HUME ST. & HWY 26

Work continues on Hume Street, and the Hurontario Street end is nearing completion, with only a final top coat of asphalt left to apply, which will be completed in 2016. Work on the Pretty River Parkway end is still ongoing, but is expected to be completed by the end of November, as scheduled.

The Town of Collingwood received joint funding from the Governments of Canada and Ontario through the Small Communities Fund, which will see each contribute up to \$1 million dollars towards the reconstruction of Hume Street.

Highway 26, from 280 m west of Princeton Shores Boulevard to Harbour Street, was identified as being in need of surface rehabilitation and improvements, and work has been ongoing since early summer.

Work is expected to be completed by the end of November, and the road will feature a continuous left turn lane along part of the road, and localized left turn lanes along the remainder of the road.

The entire section will include paved shoulders.
